# A Message from our Pas-

Hello UPC Family,



On Easter Sunday, we celebrate Jesus' triumph over death. There is good news for all of us - in the end, death does not win. God overcomes the grave. Love conquers all. We hear these words often in the church. For the longest time, the Easter story had lost its wonder for me. I heard it so much growing up, that it became normalized. I was desensitized to the awe of it all. Yes, of course, Jesus died and rose again. Cool. But what does that really mean for us here and now? Because the miracle of Easter is no normal story. The miracle of Easter is a promise - that no matter what comes our way, no matter the hardships, no matter the gravity of the situation, there is nothing that God cannot overcome. This story is all about hope.

The concept of resurrection can feel like a fairytale - a fable from long ago. And many Christians over the years have found themselves all over the spectrum when it came to their belief about resurrection - is the story literal or metaphorical? **How can someone actually rise from the dead?** I've come to realize that those kinds of debates aren't really life-giving, and they distract us from the heart of the Easter narrative. Because whether or not you believe the story is literal or metaphorical, it doesn't change this one underlying truth - that the Spirit of God is alive and on the move and there is nothing that is going to stop God from renewing and transforming our world and our lives. **God's love is greater than death itself. God's love is greater than anything the world throws at it.** 

In our lives, we are going to face many crosses. We are going to experience moments of great suffering and hardship. We are going to endure trials. We are going to know loss. But we are also going to experience many resurrections. We are going to know joy. We are going to know hope. We are going to know love. Because the cross is never the end of the story. God takes our crosses and turns them into empty tombs. God takes all the many deaths we experience and breathes new life into them. God takes our brokenness and transforms it into something beautiful. The promise of Easter is that, in the end, love wins. In the end, nothing is lost to God. The story doesn't end on Friday. Sunday is always around the corner. May you refuse to let go of that hope. May you never lose sight of the wonder and awe and promise of Easter morning - that at every end, there is a new beginning and in every death, there is new life that awaits us.


# Pub Theology
